FUTURE TENSE TIP! Future tenses use *will* or the proper present tense of *be* with *going to*

I am going to run; Edgardo will run	We are going to run; They will run
will swim, Maria is going to swim	We will swim; They are going to swim
The article will explain / is going to explain	The articles will explain / are going to explain
My teacher will want / is going to want	The supervisors will want / are going to want
The magazine will describe / is going to describe	The authors will describe / are going to describe

Present Simple

Subject	+ do, does + not + verb
I	don't play
You	don't play
He, She, It	doesn't play
We	don't play
You	don't play
They	don't play

Present Continuous

Subject	+ am, is, are + not verb + ing
I	am not playing
You	aren't playing
He, She, It	isn't playing
We	aren't playing
You	aren't playing
They	aren't playing

LET'S READ Making Predictions

Predict: to say that something will happen in the future

Carrie and Don were walking through a forest. They were enjoying the fresh air. "Do you know where we are going?" asked Don. "Oh no, I think we are lost!" Carrie replied. Then, all of a sudden...

Can you predict what happens next in this story?

Example of writing extension: 'After reading the beginning of this story, I think that there are many things that could happen. First, I think Don and Carrie will have to walk for a long time before they find out where they are. Then, I also think that while they are walking around, they are going to have many adventures, because they are in a forest and many things they don't expect will happen.'

To make predictions, where will you go? Travelling: **Section B**

When we talk about the future and what we think will happen, we can use two pieces of language:

- Will
- Going to

What is the difference between these two pieces of grammar?

- We use 'will' when something is not very certain. Our prediction is based on a feeling or emotion.
- We use 'going to' when the action is more certain. Our prediction is based on facts.
