#### Year 10

We continue into this term with our successful national tutoring programme in English and Mathematics. The 150 selected learners were tested on the W/B 24th January to see what progress they had made now that they are halfway through the 15 week initiative. Both tutors have been very impressed with the engagement of our learners and we are very excited to see the final outcomes once we test again at the end of the programme. The heads of English have again expressed their excitement at the progress this cohort is making and what they could achieve at the end of Year 11. To capture where they are in English after an important period of teaching texts such as Romeo and Juliet, they have requested an examination to take place in the school hall during Year 11 PPE week. Therefore Year 10 will be sitting their first formal examination the W/B 21st March. We are all excited to see the outcomes of this.

#### Year 11

It's been a very busy time for our Year 11 cohort in recent weeks. We had our successful parents evening on the 26th January with excellent attendance and discussions based around December PPE outcomes and how each learner can improve before the summer 2022 examination series. In terms of preparing for the upcoming summer exam series, there are lots of initiatives taking place which are really exciting! We welcome back the use of 'Walking Talking Mocks' during our period 6 and 7 in the core subjects, an initiative past cohorts have always enjoyed and benefitted from. We have started to introduce the national tutoring programme in many subjects after school for selected learners. In addition to this, weekend and before school interventions have started in many of the subjects and we stress the importance of attendance to these excellent sessions. Information on what interventions are taking place each week will be emailed to learners at the start of each week. We are fast approaching the second PPE series, where we will be sitting internal exams in all subjects. This is a very important series and we urge learners to ensure they are fully prepared. As we enter the second half of Year 10, it has been noticeable how learners are working hard towards their GCSE exams. This is reflected in the excellent data we have received from teachers for the year group.

The January reports with all grades and targets along with the effort grades for each subject have been sent home. It is extremely important to understand the report and discuss it with your child. We have had some face to face meetings with some parents but please note that we are available to discuss if you have any concerns about the report.

Although we are still around 14 months away from the final exams, we cannot stress enough how important being in school is. Evidence states that attendance and punctuality are directly correlated to academic success. Learners who finish the year with 90% attendance will have missed 4 whole weeks of lessons and missing such a large amount of content will have a great impact on their ability to successfully complete exam questions.






#### YEAR 9 AND 10 ARMY CADETS



#### YEAR 7 ENGLISH


