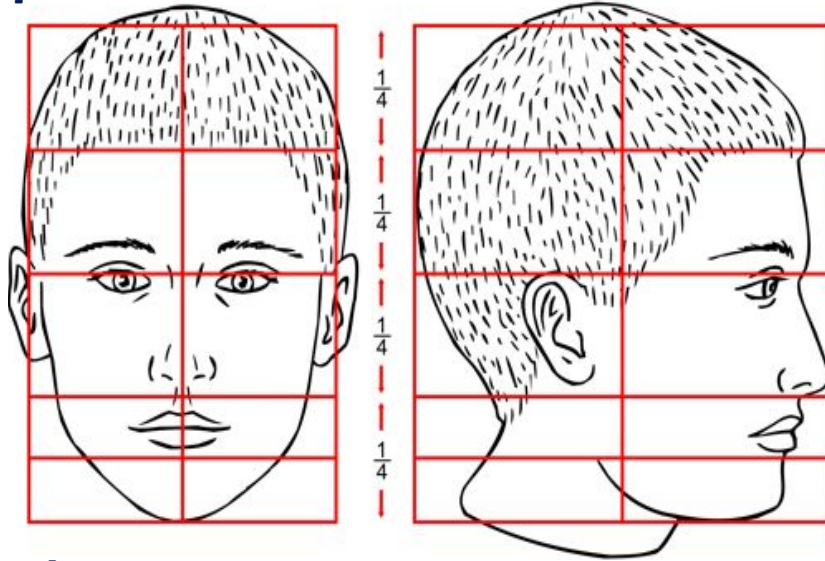

Key Words	Meaning
<b>Chiaroscuro</b>	Having extreme contrast of light and dark
<b>Graphic</b>	A 2 dimensional representation
<b>Figurative</b>	Works of art that we can easily recognise objects as the world we know
<b>Scale</b>	The size of an object next to others
<b>Self Portrait</b>	When an artists makes a portrait of themselves.

Types of portraits	Information
<b>Traditional</b>	An image where face is the predominant element.
<b>Environmental</b>	The subject is photographed in person's natural environment.
<b>Candid</b>	A candid portrait is taken without a subject expecting or acknowledging the photographer/artist.
<b>Fashion</b>	Where emphasis is given to highlight an item of importance.
<b>Lifestyle</b>	The term Lifestyle Portrait refers to portraits where emphasis is given to suggest the "style of living" of the individuals depicted.
<b>Surreal</b>	Surreal Portraits are created to emphasize a made up reality.
<b>Conceptual</b>	Conceptual Portrait refers to images where concept adds a fourth dimension. The hidden meaning of the concept will leave the viewer guessing as it is often open for interpretation.
<b>Abstract</b>	Abstract portraits are created with a purpose of creating art and not based on realistic representation of a person.
