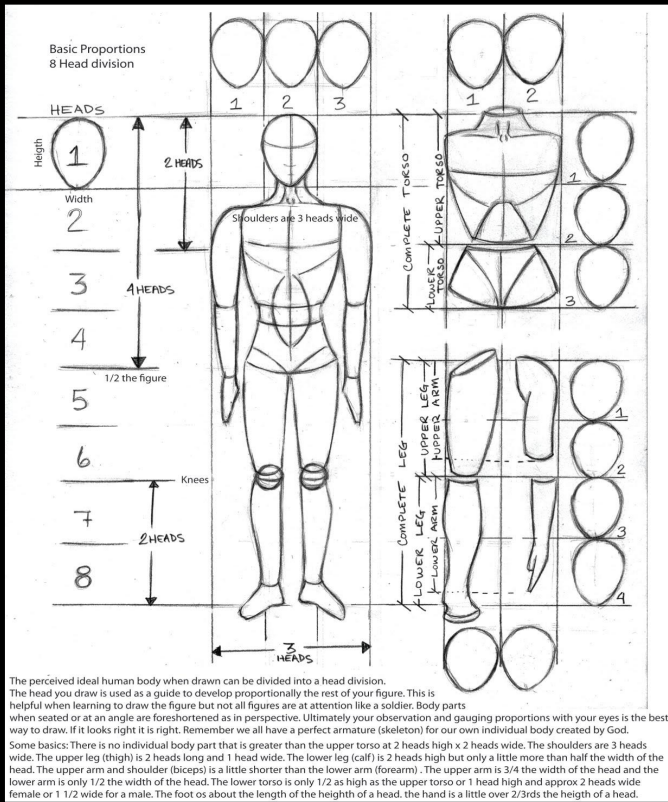

Comic books emerged in the **1930s**  
A **comic** strip is a sequence of drawings, often cartoons. The technique for adding tone to and colour in comic books is known as **Ben-Day dot**.

An abbreviation of Popular Art, Pop art is characterized by a **deconstruction of images seen in popular culture** – television, comic books, magazines, movies and other various forms of advertising

Andy Warhol (1928 -1987)

Andy Warhol was the most influential Pop Artist. He used the silkscreen process to transfer photographic images onto canvas. He used images of celebrities and mass- produced, commercial products.

Roy Lichtenstein (1923 – 1997)



In the Car - 1963

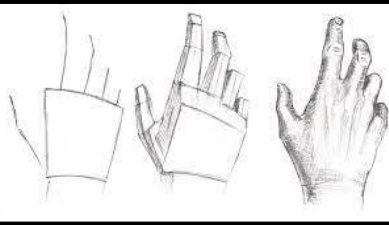
Roy Lichtenstein is famed for his paintings based on comic strips, often depicting tense, dramatic situations. He restricted himself to using primary colours as well as black and white.

Keith Haring (1958 -1990)

Keith Allen Haring was an American artist whose pop art emerged from the New York City graffiti subculture of the 1980s. His animated imagery has "become a widely recognized visual language"



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
