

A. Keywords and Meanings		
Keyword	Definition	
Figurative	Representing forms that are recognizably derived from life.	
Portrait	A portrait is a painting, photograph, sculpture, or other artistic representation of a person, in which the face and its expression is predominant. The intent is to display the likeness, personality, and even the mood of the person.	
Chiaroscuro	This is an Italian term which literally means 'light-dark'. In paintings the description refers to clear tonal contrasts which are often used to suggest the volume and modelling of the subjects depicted. Artists who are famed for the use of <i>chiaroscuro</i> include Leonardo da Vinci and Caravaggio.	
Surreal	Dream-like, unexpected, improbable.	
Focal Point	The focal point of a painting is an area of emphasis that demands the most attention and to which the viewer's eye is drawn, pulling it into the painting

B. Art Genres	
Graffiti Art	Writing or drawings that have been scribbled, scratched, or painted, typically illicitly, on a wall or other surface,
Cubism	Cubism was the first abstract art style. Cubist painting abandoned the tradition of perspective drawing and displayed many views of a subject at one time.
Neo Dada	The term is applied to the work of artists such as Robert Rauschenberg and Jasper Johns because of their use of Collage, assemblage and found materials.
Pop Art	Pop art is an art movement that emerged in the 1950s and flourished in the 1960s in America and Britain, drawing inspiration from sources in popular and commercial culture. Different cultures and countries contributed to the movement during the 1960s and 70s.
