Acrylic Paint	Acrylic paint is a fast-drying paint made of pigment suspended in acrylic polymer emulsion. Acrylic paints are water soluble but become water resistant when dry		
Oil Paint	Oil paint is a slow drying paint that consists of particles of pigment suspended in a drying oil, commonly linseed oil		
Vatercolour	Watercolour is a painting method in which the paints are made of pigments suspended in a water based solution. Watercolour refers to both the medium and the resulting artwork		
Collage	Collage is a technique of art production, primarily used in the visual arts, where the artwork is made from an assemblage of different forms, thereby creating a new whole.
