



Section C - The UK population and currency



The population of the UK is 66.5 million. England has 84% of the UK population. Scotland has 8% of the UK population, Wales has 5% of the UK population and Northern Ireland has 3% of the UK population.



The official currency of the United Kingdom is the pound sterling, known as the pound (£, GBP). Each pound is divided into 100 pence (100p = £1).






