Section A - Key vocabulary

KEY WORD	SYNONYM / DEFINITION
Phonics	A method of teaching people to read by correlating sounds with symbols in an alphabetic writing system.
Phoneme	The smallest units of sounds that be found in a word : using 1 or more letters eg. 'ai' 'ee' 't'
Diagraph	Two letters which make one sound 'ea' 'ay' 'sh'
Segmenting	The opposite of blending. Splitting a word into individual sounds, used for spelling and writing.
Blending	Saying the individual sounds which make up a word and merging the sounds together to say the word.
Syllable	Small group of sound that you hear in each word. Each syllable must have a vowel sound.
Vowel	A, E, I, O, U
Consonant	B, C, D, F, G, H, J, K, L, M, N, P, Q, R, S, T, V, X, Z, and usually W and Y


