Key Vocabulary

Identity: The characteristics that define who someone is.

Community: A group of people living together and sharing common interests.

Leadership: The act of guiding or directing a group of people.

Laws: Rules that govern the behaviour of a community.

Sacred: Something considered holy or of great value, often in a religious context.

Rituals: Established procedures and ceremonies that are regularly followed.

Myth: A traditional story, often involving supernatural beings or events, that explains a natural or social phenomenon.

Belief: An acceptance that something exists or is true, especially without proof.

Religion: A system of faith and worship.

Personal Identity: Who you are as an individual.

Social Identity: How your identity is shaped by the groups you belong to (e.g., family, nationality, religion).

Importance: Identity helps define a person's role within a community and influences how they interact with others.

Definition: A group of individuals who share common values and support each other.

Importance: Communities provide a sense of belonging, security, and support.

Connection to Religion: Religious communities often provide a shared identity and support system for their members.
