


Vote Results:

This week's VoteTopic:

Two weeks ago, we celebrated Black History Month by discussing whether you feel that your history and identity are represented in the school curriculum. Here's what you said (we will be doing another review of your results at the end of the month too!):

Does the curriculum represent you?
