

UCAS DAY

At Harrow High Sixth Form we ensure that our students have full knowledge and understanding of the pathways available to them post-18 and encourage our students to pursue aspirational routes which include Higher Educational degrees and apprenticeships. We begin this process at the beginning of Year 12, encouraging students to pursue super-curricular activities and attend virtual events.

On Friday 9th July, Year 12 attended a University and Careers preparation programme within the Sixth Form, delivered by Mr Patel, Ms Guthrie and Ms Mehta. Each student was offered three sessions on different aspects of the process: the application process on the UCAS hub and meeting deadlines; personal statement workshops and course and unifrog research tasks. Following on from this, our HPA learners, Oxbridge and Medicine applicants will now attend a mock interview with Mr. Patel and receive weekly support with their applications during Ms Guthrie's super-curricular club.

In addition, during the last week of term, each student will attend a UCAS interview appointment with a member of the Sixth Firm team to ensure they have the best chance of being accepted to their first choice institutions when the application window opens in September 2021.

YEAR 12 EXCURSION TO BRIGHTON BEACH

SAFEGUARDING

REPORTING ILLNESS AND ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

We place great importance on attendance and punctuality at school; not just to avoid missing out on learning, but also to foster good habits for the world of work in years to come.

We expect a minimum of 95% attendance for every child. To help achieve this parents/carers should:

- encouraging their child to attend school regularly and punctually and to appreciate the importance of good attendance
- making every attempt to arrange dental and medical appointments outside of school hours.

Late procedure

If your child is late for school, they must report to the Attendance Office as soon as they arrive. The register can then be updated and they will be asked to explain their lateness.

Please note that lateness is likely to result in a 20 minute detention immediately after school. Parents/carers will receive an email notifying them of their child's detention.

Absence procedure

If your child is unable to attend school the following steps should be followed:

- 1. Telephone the school absence line on 0208 861 7303, before 9:00am.
- 2. Choose the option to leave a message to report your child's absence.
- 3. Make sure you say your child's name and form group.
- 4. Provide a clear and specific explanation for the absence
- 5. If your child is absent for more than one day, please call each day to report this.

Unreported Absence

In the case of unreported absences, the school uses SIMS 'In Touch' to notify parents and carers by text or email that their child is not in school. Should you receive such a message, for safeguarding reasons we would ask you to respond to us immediately.

Medical/Dentist appointments

Please try and make medical/dental appointments at the beginning or end of the day so your child can still attend school on that day.

- If your child's medical or dentist appointment is during the school day, contact the school in advance with these details.
- Alternatively, send your child with the appointment card to the Attendance Office and a note will be put on the register authorising the absence.
- Unless learners have an early appointment, we expect them to attend school first and then go to their appointment. We also expect them to return to school afterwards.

Support from school

Please do let us know if there is a difficulty with your child's attendance and you need our support. If your child starts missing school, there may be a problem we are not aware of. We want every child to have great attendance so that they have every opportunity to meet their potential. If your child's attendance is low or irregular, we will write to you. We may also want to meet with you to agree a plan to improve your child's attendance.

SIMs Parent App

Parents are able to monitor their child's attendance and punctuality to lessons by using the SIMs Parent App.

Leave of absence during term time

Harrow High School will not authorise absence in term time unless it is for exceptional circumstances. Parents or carers who choose to take their children out of school during term time, face the possibility of being fined.

For any absence due to exceptional circumstances, permission must be sought in writing from the Headteacher well in advance and before any travel is booked. Failure to do this could result in a fine or prosecution.

MEET ME - Dating app that allows users to connect with others based on geographic location



SKOUT - Location based dating app that lets users share private photos

GRINDR - Dating app geared towards LGBTQ community that uses phone's GPS location to find others

WHATSAPP - Messaging app that allows users to connect worldwide



TIKTOK - Popular app for kids that allows users to create and share short videos



BADOO - Dating and social media app for sharing photos and videos



BUMBLE - Similar to tinder, but requires females to make first contact



SNAPCHAT - Photos and videos shared to the app typically disappear within 24 hours



KIK - Anyone can contact and direct message other users on the app



LIVE.ME - Streaming video app that broadcasts users exact location



HOLLA - Video chat app that allows users to meet people all over the world



WHISPER - Anonymous social network that promotes sharing secrets with strangers



ASK.FM - Encourages users to allow anonymous people to ask them questions



CALCULATOR% - One of many secret apps that is used to hide photos, videos and browser history



HOT OR NOT - Users can rate profile photos and chat with strangers
