<b>Application software</b>	Software designed to carry out a specific task for the user	<b>Copyright</b>	The legal right, given to the originator for a fixed number of years, to print, publish, perform, film, or record literary, artistic, or musical material	<b>Credibility</b>	The believability of a source or message	<p>What can happen if I use an image without permission?</p> <p>Write four sentences.</p>
<b>Word processor</b>	A program that enables input, editing, formatting and output of text	<b>Licensing</b>	An official permission or permit to do, use, or own something	<b>Source</b>	A place, person, or thing from which something originates	
<b>Formatting</b>	Enables a user to specify how a document will look on screen or when printed	<b>Creative Commons</b>	A global non-profit organization that enables sharing and reuse of creative works	<b>Audience</b>	The group of people for whom you are developing your work	
<b>Fonts</b>	A collection of characters with a similar design	<b>Text wrapping</b>	Controls how images are positioned relative to text	<b>Plagiarism</b>	The practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own	
<b>Icons</b>	A pictogram displayed on a computer screen designed to help a user navigate a computer system	<b>Cropping</b>	Allows you to resize images to a specific shape, or remove parts of an image	<b>Referencing</b>	Means acknowledging your source; when you use someone else's work, stating this in a reference.
